Curators Corner

There is an error in the article that appeared last month about various Downtown Buildings. In waxing nostalgic over the delights of Steelhammer's soda fountain, emphasis on chocolate messes for ten cents, I didn't pay enough attention to the relationships of the owners of Steelhammers. I wrote ".....Harry Carson Jr.'s father was married to Letty Steelhammer" which is not correct. Letty Steelhammer was a sister to Harry Carson Sr., not a wife. Letty Carson married George Steelhammer and after he died, Harry Carson Sr. managed Steelhammer's for his sister, eventually buying the business. Thanks Jack; I appreciate you calling that to my attention.

There was one donation that came in last month which I didn't have time to tell you about: Gary and Nancy Ohren donated the Warranty Deed and the Abstract of Title from Gary's parent's estate. Oliver and Beatrice Ohren had bought two lots that were part of the Phelps Addition, so the Abstract has some very old names.... T.W. Davenport, Benedict Phelps, J.M Brown; the oldest date I could find, with just a brief glance, was 1863.

The walls and woodwork in the Doctor's Room have been painted thanks to Gary Ohren and Ray and Kathy Hunter. Now begins the process of moving things back into the room and setting up a new display, using the hospital bed that was donated from the Knauf family.

Every year we have an annual cleaning day to get the museum ready for visitors when we open in February. I'm going to schedule two dates this year, just in case we don't get everything done. Tentative dates for cleaning are Tuesday, Jan. 26 and Tuesday, February 2.

Again, we are hoping for more volunteers, especially for hosting at the museum. If we got four more interested volunteers we could expand our Open days to three per week instead of just on the week-end. Silverton has lots of visitors in the spring and summer on other days of the week and I'd love to have the museum

open on a Friday-Saturday-Sunday schedule.

There are also the prospects of some new projects: one idea proposed by the Oregon Garden Group Tour coordinator, Douglas Jenkins, is to have a step-on tour bus guide telling visitors about Silverton's history. A second idea is to start a photo survey of the types of houses in Silverton, along with, hopefully, their history.

We didn't get very many oral histories done last year. Hopefully we can do better in 2010.

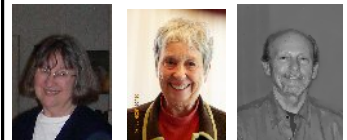


Photograph taken in 1912 by W.L. Jones of the Woodmen of the World Hall built in 1907, now the site of the Oak Street Church.
